SUPPORTING WOUNDED VETERANS PIONEER FUND

I write to you as the Patron of a small but ground-breaking charity called Supporting Wounded Veterans. Today we are launching a new fund called our Pioneer Fund. Our goal is to raise £1 million to fund research into innovative ways of treating veterans with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, chronic anxiety, depression and unending pain.

Our Armed Forces and their veterans have been extraordinarily well supported through charitable giving during the campaigns in Iraq and Afghanistan. However, we have now reached a point long after the combat phases of these campaigns have come to a close, when the long-term mental effects of intense combat operations are sadly beginning to show.

Many of these veterans have made remarkable sacrifices on behalf of our country. And as they have transitioned to civilian life, and left behind the comradery of Service life, the physical, mental and emotional scars of battle are being exposed. Treating these illnesses is very challenging. So, it is very exciting that a new and innovative treatment is potentially becoming available.

Methylenedioxymethamphetamine or MDMA as it is known is being trialled with psychotherapy for those with severe and treatment-resistant PTSD. Early results suggest this treatment is truly ground-breaking. The charity has commissioned King's College London to work in partnership with MAPS, a non-profit organisation who is pioneering research with MDMA assisted psychotherapy in the United States, to further develop the treatment.

We know that MDMA assisted psychotherapy is unorthodox. And we know that it will provoke questions and even objections, given the unusual nature of the therapeutic agents involved. However, we are clear that the weight of science is behind it. Current studies in the United States are proving to be dramatically more effective than other treatments at relieving the pain and removing the stigma of PTSD. We - and importantly - our veterans are convinced it merits further study and trial.

Victory on the battlefield is secured by the side that is most innovative. PTSD is a truly debilitating and life-threatening battle – defeating it requires innovation. I hope that you might feel bold enough to support our appeal. It promises genuinely to make a difference to the lives of wounded veterans who deserve the chance to live normal lives.

THE SUPPORTING WOUNDED VETERANS SKI

CHALLENGE combines supporting the rehabilitation of medically discharged Veterans back into employment with a fun, adrenaline-fueled weekend in Switzerland. It gives our Veterans an unparalleled opportunity to meet members of the business community, understand more about the corporate world, share their experiences, and is a critical part of our annual fundraising. Participants compete with and against our Veterans, and the challenge is designed to ensure that able-bodied and disabled skiers compete on equal terms – you do not have to be of or anywhere near Olympic standard to take part.

UK FORCES have been deployed on operations continuously over the last 30 years in conflicts ranging from Northern Ireland, the Balkans, Sierra Leone, Iraq, Afghanistan and more recently Libya and Syria. Since 2002 over 22,000 Veterans have been medically discharged, often with limited access to the infrastructure required to either fully recover or prepare them for the long route back to meaningful employment.

SUPPORTING WOUNDED VETERANS

Our purpose is to help medically discharged Wounded Veterans back into meaningful civilian life and employment – many of our Veterans have been told they will never be able to work again.

Our key programmes that address the physical and mental needs of the Veterans are:

- 'Sporthabilitation'
- Mentoring
- Pain management and pain medication reviews
- Occupation and training

VETERAN REPRESENTATIVES

Veterans who have previously been on our Ski Weeks and other programmes are keen to 'give back' and apply to become a volunteer Veteran Representative. These 'Vet Reps' have helped to run and manage the Ski Challenge for the last three years.

Auction
